

Children of Africa benefit raises more than \$8,000 for mission

Lili Kohr's Crusade for the Children of Africa, a benefit held recently at Fish On in Lewes, raised more than \$8,000 for supplies needed to build a school, orphanage and working farm in

rural Zimbabwe.

The benefit was held by Lili Kohr, owner of Tiger Lili in Rehoboth and former Mrs. Delaware, who will embark on her third trip to Africa later this

month. More than 200 people attended the event that featured music and entertainment, dancing, a live auction and a 50/50 raffle.

In a few weeks, Kohr will join other volunteers that comprise Dynamis World Ministries to spread faith and hope among children and families that face daily battles of survival against hunger and AIDS. The ambi-

tious plan to take donated land and cultivate it into a farm, school and orphanage is designed to promote prosperity and sustainability by educating children in the classroom and by teaching families to successfully work the land.

"I deeply appreciate everyone's support, and the money raised will go far in making a difference for children and families

who so desperately need hope," said Kohr. "Our goals for the October trip are enormous but now even more achievable with the help of our community."
